 - 7.2.1 has a degree or post graduate qualification in a relevant subject and has a minimum of four years relevant continuous experience in wastes management and has undergone such programme of structured learning and development as may be determined by the General Council:

Retired Member

7. A Member of the Institution who ceases to be actively engaged in wastes management may transfer to the class of Retired Member with the approval of the General Council.

Retired Member

8. A Full or Ordinary Member of CIWM who ceases to be actively engaged in resource and waste management may transfer to the class of Retired Member with the approval of the General Council.

Affiliated Organisation
